The Future of Sociology

In the Spring of 2007 the *Electronic Journal of Sociology* will produce its first ever print edition. The print edition, which will be subsequently produced annually and available internationally, will usher in an exciting new era in publication for the EJS. In order to mark this significant event in the history of the Electronic Journal, the EJS is now soliciting manuscripts for the premier print edition of the journal.

The theme of the premier edition will be *The Future of Sociology*.

We ask scholars to consider the past, present, and future of the discipline, whether or not sociology remains relevant and connected to the concerns of the day, whether it still has a contribution to make to the evolution (or revolution) of society, or whether it has lost its ability to challenge and become assimilated into the status quo.

Scholars are asked to be as open and honest in their assessment. Questions include the relationship between sociology and the political sphere, the linkage (or lack thereof) between sociology and concerns of the masses, sociology's ability to explain ongoing problems of wealth distribution and the uneven exercise of global power, sociology's ability to help us understand hegemonic control of various populations, etc.

In other words, ask whether sociology can help explain why things are as they are and how they have changed. Can sociology make useful and usable contributions to the current world debates and issues.

Papers outside the guidelines above, but still fitting within the general theme of *The Future of Sociology* will also be accepted.
